

Prescribing Change: Helping Patients Say Yes to the Care They Need Dr. Steve Vargo

Many optometrists deliver exceptional care — yet still struggle to get patients to say yes to recommended products or services. Whether it's premium eyewear, dry eye treatment, or myopia management, patients often hesitate, defaulting to low-cost options or delaying care altogether.

This challenge not only affects clinical and financial outcomes — it's also deeply frustrating for doctors, contributing to growing rates of burnout across the profession.

Prescribing Change takes a deep (and often humorous) look at the real reasons patients hesitate. Based on the principles from Dr. Steve Vargo's best-selling book, this talk reveals how even well-intentioned doctors can unintentionally talk patients out of the care they need. It introduces a practical framework for building trust, creating emotional connection, and communicating value in a way that resonates.

Through engaging stories, behavioral psychology, and real-world examples, this session empowers doctors to move from simply delivering information to inspiring action. Attendees will walk away with proven communication strategies they can apply immediately — leading to better patient outcomes, stronger financial performance, and a renewed sense of purpose in their work.

Dr. Steve Vargo, OD, MBA is the Optometric Practice Management Consultant for IDOC. Since transitioning to a full-time practice management consultant in 2014, Dr. Vargo has performed over 3,000 consultations and coaching sessions with hundreds of independent optometry practices across the country. He speaks regularly at industry conferences, has been published in numerous industry publications, has a regular column in Optometric Management titled "The CEO Challenge", and hosts the popular Eye Own a business podcast. Dr. Vargo has also authored 4 books on the subjects of staff management, leadership and patient communication.

Connecting Generations in the Workplace

Filters, Fresnels and Foils OH MY!: Learning the Wizardry of Lens Applications

Filter, Fresnels, and Foils OH MY! This lecture aims to shine light on several less common lens uses and applications. The lecture will review Fresnel Prisms, Bangerter Foils and various types of filters including customized tints, contrast enhancing filters, binasal occlusion, and sector occlusion. Several patient cases will be shared in order to enhance learning through real world examples.

Finding the Perfect Fit for Protective Eyewear

Al Amarshi

This session will provide an understanding of safety compliance as it relates to finding the correct fit. The session will also introduce the "Perfect Fit" tool and show clinic staff how to use the tool to correctly measure gaps. The session will also discuss common themes in the sale of protective eyewear, including the understanding of different frame and lens options.

Going Beyond 20/20 Vision with Contoured Prism

Iennifer Boser

This session is designed specifically for opticians to deepen their understanding of Contoured Prism technology and its role in transforming patient outcomes.

We'll explore how modern lifestyles—filled with screens, digital devices, and prolonged near work—contribute to symptoms like eye strain, headaches, Motion sickness, and neck pain. Introduction to Optometry and Eye Anatomy

This presentation provides an overview of optometrists' role in health care and public safety. Optometry maintains visual standards critical to road, occupational, and public safety. We will also cover key anatomical structures of the eye and their functions in the visual process. Emphasis will be placed on how these components interact to allow sight and the structures affected in common conditions such as refractive error, cataracts, posterior vitreous detachment, age-related macular degeneration, and glaucoma. By the end of the session, attendees will gain insights on the full scope of optometry and the anatomical basis for visual disorders.

Many Solutions to the Problem

Myopia Management Overview

Ocular Surface Disease 101

Ocular Surface Disease (OSD) is one of the most common conditions in the eye and usually has a direct impact on high quality vision required for daily activities. This course will examine the basics and some higher level concepts to improve OSD will be discussed. Particular attention to blepharitis will be discussed.

Pediatric Eye Exams

Working With TBI Patients

This course will discuss the eye care provider role in traumatic brain injury (TBI) management. It will review the types of brain injuries and how they are classified into mild TBI, diffuse axonal injury and chronic traumatic encephalopathy (CTE). The etiology and disease course of CTE will be reviewed, especially as it relates to football related head injuries. The course will also describe an ophthalmologic work up for a patient that has experienced a TBI.

Behind the Lens: The Why & How of Alcon Multifocal Contact Lens Fitting (Alcon Sponsored Session)
