Evidence-informed policy and decision-making requires valid and timely information. To this end, CNA maintains key nursing databases, including:

- the RN student/faculty database1
- the Canadian Registered Nurse Exam database²
- the certification database
- the Canadian registered nurse database³

What's in the Works?

CNA is currently in discussions with licensed practical nurse and registered psychiatric nurse groups to expand the student/faculty database to include their data. CNA is also working with provincial/territorial governments to define data requirements for health human resources planning purposes.

Why Are CNA's Databases Important?

CNA analyzes these databases to identify emerging issues, inform policy-making, evaluate policy decisions, monitor progress on the implementation of various policy recommendations, project nurse supply, and support effective and accurate health human resources planning.

Who Uses CNA's Data and Reports?

Governments, researchers, students, administrators, faculty, international organizations and many others regularly request data and analytical reports. On average, CNA receives and responds to 30 statistical inquiries on nursing education and supply data each month.

Quick Facts

On average, there are 800 downloads of the RN workforce profile report and 1,500 of the student faculty reports each month from the CNA website.

The RN specialty workforce report shows that 29% of RNs working in community health, operating room/recovery room and home care were eligible to retire in 2005.
