Chart of General Rules Relating to Motions

Motions in order of precedence

Motion	Example	Sec.	Debate	Amend	Vote	Notes
1. Fix time to which to adjourn	<i>I move that when the meeting adjourns, we meet at __ (time).</i>	✓		✓	Majority	Privileged motion.
2. Adjourn	<i>I move to adjourn.</i>	✓			Majority	Privileged motion.
3. Recess	<i>I move to recess for __ minutes.</i>	✓		✓	Majority	Privileged motion.
4. Raise a question of privilege	<i>I rise to a question of privilege.</i>				None	Privileged motion. Ruled upon by chair.
5. Call for orders of the day	<i>I call for orders of the day.</i>				None	Privileged motion. Enforced by demand of one member.
6. Lay on table	<i>I move to lay the motion on the table.</i>	✓			Majority	Lays aside a motion when more urgent business arises.
7. Previous question	<i>I move the previous question.</i>	✓			2/3	If adopted, closes debate and amendment.
8. Limit/extend debate	<i>I move to limit debate to __ minutes.</i>	✓		✓	2/3	May change length of speeches or length of debate.
9. Postpone definitely	<i>I move to postpone the motion till __ (e.g., 3 p.m.).</i>	✓	✓	✓	Majority	Debate confined to merits of postponing question.

10. Commit/recommit	<i>I move to refer this motion to a committee.</i>	✓	✓	✓	Majority	Debate confined to merits of referring motion to committee.
11. Amend	<i>I move to amend the motion by ...</i>	✓	✓	✓	Majority	Debatable only if applicable motion is debatable.
12. Postpone indefinitely	<i>I move to postpone this motion indefinitely.</i>	✓	✓		Majority	Debate may go into merits of main motion. Adoption kills motion.
13. Main motion (may be moved only when no other motion is pending)	<i>I move that ...</i>	✓	✓	✓	Majority	<p>Introduces business to assembly.</p> <p>Motions in respect of certain issues may require a Special Resolution as per the <i>Canada Not-for-Profit Corporations Act</i>.</p> <p>When a motion is made on a Special Resolution the Chair will indicate to the assembly that a 2/3 vote is required.</p>

Motions with no special order

Point of order	<i>I rise to a point of order.</i>				None	Ruled upon by chair. May interrupt a speaker only if necessary.
Appeal	<i>I appeal the decision of the chair.</i>	✓	✓		Majority	Move at time of ruling by chair. Non-debatable if pending motion is not debatable.
Suspend rules	<i>I move to suspend the rule and ...</i>	✓			2/3	Bylaws may never be suspended except those in the nature of rules of order.
Objection to consideration	<i>I object to consideration of this question.</i>				2/3	In order only until debate on original main motion begins.
Division of assembly	<i>I request a division.</i>				None	To confirm the result of a vote, one member may demand a rising vote.
Division of question	<i>I move to divide the motion by ...</i>	✓		✓	Majority	Separates motion if feasible.
Point of information	<i>I rise to a point of information.</i>				None	To ask a factual question. May interrupt a speaker if important.
Reconsider	<i>I move to reconsider the vote on the motion re ...</i>	✓	✓		Majority	Must be made by member who voted on prevailing side. Non-debatable if motion to be reconsidered is not debatable.

Motion	Example	Sec.	Debate	Amend	Vote	Notes
Take from the table	<i>I move to take the motion re ... from the table.</i>	✓			Majority	Brings a tabled motion back to the assembly.
Withdraw a motion	<i>I ask permission to withdraw the motion.</i>	✓			Majority	Usually done by unanimous consent.
Amend bylaws	<i>I move to amend the bylaws by ...</i>	✓	✓	✓	Majority or 2/3	Certain issues may require a Special Resolution as per the <i>Canada Not-for-Profit Corporations Act</i> . A Special Resolution requires a 2/3 majority vote.
